FOREWARD

This collection of Knoxville News-Sentinel (TN) articles was begun in February 2020 for the purpose of making historical information available for the 90th Anniversary Celebration of North Knoxville Baptist Church in Knoxville, TN. The Celebration was scheduled for March 29, 2000, but was cancelled because of the COVID-19 Pandemic. The church was founded January 19, 1930.

This is a fairly complete set of articles published from 1930 through 2023 in the Knoxviile News-Sentinel about North Knoxville Baptist Church. A few articles were omitted because they had no useful information concerning the history of the church. The search engine failed to find all files pertaining to the church, but no doubt it found the vast majority of them. All images were obtained by copying from the website of the Knox County Library System, and a personal subscription to Newspapers by Ancestry. com. Some of the images, particularly photos, did not reproduce well when they were digitized for the websites.

Some articles were modified by piecing them back together in a more readable format to fit the layout of the articles. Type sizes varied as well as sometimes being spread over several columns or pages, and photos were separated from articles. Also, a few of the referenced page numbers shown are sometimes off by one or two pages.

Knox Southern Baptists plan 'massive' crusade

Southern Baptists of Knox County will conduct a massive Greater Knoxville Crusade Aug. 3-8 at the Civic Coliseum.

Leaders said it will be the largest event of this kind here since the Billy Graham Crusade of 1970 in Neyland Stadium.

Bailey Smith of Dell City, Okla., evangelist and former Southern Baptist Convention president, and John McKay of Fort Worth, Texas, music evangelist for the past 25 years, will lead the crusade.

More than 900 persons attended a planning session and banquet Monday night at the Knoxville Convention Center. The representatives pledged their churches would finance the event before it takes place.

All 155 Southern Baptist Churches in Knox County, as well as churches in neighboring communities, will be asked to participate.

The Rev. Rocky Ramsey, pastor of Corryton Baptist Church, and the Rev. Guy Milam, pastor of North Knoxville Baptist Church, are co-chairmen of the event. They expect capacity crowds at the crusade.

The Graham Crusade was held in Knoxville in May 1970. It drew capacity crowds in Neyland Stadium and the night President Richard Nixon appeared on the speaker's stand with Graham the crowd swelled to 10,000 more than the seating capacity of the stadium.

Graham was in Knoxville 10 days. Crowds were so big a staff of 2,500 ushers was needed to fill the stadium in an orderly manner. A staff member preceded the visit, moving into offices on Gay Street in September before the May crusade.

Incinerator foes find broad-based backing for fight

They're a cross-section of people galvanized by a shared concern over a \$175 million plan to build a garbage incinerator.

They have different reasons for questioning the plans of the Metropolitan Solid Waste Authority, but members of the Alliance for Incinerator Review are working toward a common goal.

Among the groups involved: City People, a group of professionals geared toward improving downtown; Solutions to Issues of Concern to Knoxvillians, an inner-city group concerned about health and community issues; Old North Knoxville Inc., a neighborhood and preservation group; and neighborhood associations such as the Fourth and Gill Neighborhood Organization, Parkridge Community Organization, Oakwood Neighborhood Association, Old Mechanicsville Neighborhood Interest and Beaumont Neighborhood Association.

Churches are involved, too. North Knoxville Baptist, Central United Methodist and Emerald Avenue Methodist have lent their support.

The Rev. Guy Milam, pastor of North Knoxville Baptist Church, shares Miller's concern about the location. The church is a few blocks from the Baxter site.

"Mostly we're concerned about the gases and fumes, the amount of racket and noise that will come from the incinerator," Milam said. "We're just concerned generally about how we'll be able to cope as a church."

The congregation's recent investment in property to expand its ministry could be jeopardized if the incinerator is built nearby, Milam said.

"We're not against incineration," Milam said.
"We're in full sympathy with trying to find an answer to the garbage disposal problem. But this community has been the whipping boy for a lot of things over the years."

North Knoxville Baptists prepare to bridge a gap

North Knoxville Baptist Church is fixing to take on a big job — again.

Sixty-one years ago the church's founders met in a little store building at Emerald Avenue and Worth Street to form a mission. Today the church has 1,192 members, and the building at 217 W. Oldham Ave. has a new sanctuary that seats 576 and a choir loft for 50.

For some time the church has felt the pinch of a

lack of parking space.

"We are more than a neighborhood church," says the Rev. Guy M. Milam, pastor for 22 years. "We have members from all over the county. When they drive 20 miles one way to go to church, they need a place to park."

Across Oldham Avenue from the church is a graveled parking lot. Between the parking lot and Woodland Avenue is a ravine — about 35 feet deep, 100 feet long and 65 feet wide. At the bottom is a ditch where a wet-weather stream flows into Second Creek. It is called Black Creek by residents of the area because of the industrial wastes that are dumped into it.

The church plans to fill the ravine — all the way to Woodland Avenue. It is anybody's guess how many

truckloads of fill dirt that will require.

"We plan to put tile in the ravine and level it off to Woodland and put in a beautiful entrance on Woodland," Milam says. "It will enhance the community."

The church has a 59-year history of achieving. The Rev. Jimmy Day founded a mission in 1928 that met in the little store. Two years later the church was organized in the same store. It was Jan. 19, a cold, dreary day. They had no building, just the faith to work and grow. The Rev. William Teffeteller was the first pastor.

They found a lot at Oldham Avenue and Worth Street, where the present church stands. On Sunday, May 4, 1930, the call went out for funds for the building committee. In 1980 the church published a 50-year history which contains these lines:

"The Sunday school donated \$10. Brother Spears

donated \$3.50; G.W. Myers through the grace of God was able to donate \$10; the Rev. Jimmy Day was able to donate \$4. Sister O'Dell was able to donate \$6....

"The total in the building fund was \$41.50. George Lakins and the other men in the church mortgaged their furniture to secure the loan to purchase the lot."

The first white frame church building was built with the sweat of the members. The entire building was put up with volunteer labor. A Mr. Bates who lived on the corner helped direct much of the construction.

On May 11, 1931, a beautiful, sunny day, the congregation "came to church" in its new building.

The congregation continued to grow during the pre-war and World War II years. Its members gave in effort and offerings.

On Nov. 15, 1953, the Rev. Kerr Weifenbarger, pastor, stepped to the pulpit in a new, 26-room building. Where once had been a sawdust floor and hand-carpentered planks for pews there was now a fine wood floor with beautiful oak pews.

Near tragedy struck the church in 1954, when fire broke out in the upper floor and attic. Knoxville fire-

fighters held the damage to \$10,000.

During the 1920s to 1950s, the suburbs had not yet begun to draw people from the city. Communities such as North Knoxville were close-knit units where most families knew each other and attended the same church and social functions. However, during the late 1950s and early 1960s Interstate 75 was built, only two-and-a-half to three blocks from the church. Its construction had the very real effect of physically dividing the community in half. Oldham Avenue was now a dead-end street. Hundreds of homes were completely removed for the right of way. The congregation was experiencing zero growth.

The members refused to sit down and quit. To accommodate the growing number of children in the congregation, they built a wing with a nursery and

young married people's department.

The church started to grow again, adding a chil-

dren's church and a recreational and fellowship building.

Then, early on the morring of Nov. 27, 1980, disaster struck. A fire heavily damaged the sanctuary and caused water and smoke damage to most of the rest of the church. The fire was thought to be arson, but no arrest was ever made.

The congregation rebuilt and refurbished the complex at a cost of \$625,000. That job is paid for.

Milam, 54, has been pastor 22 years. He is a native of Tennessee's Madison County and a graduate of Harrison-Chilhowee Baptist Academy in Seymour. He completed his theological studies at Union University in Jackson, Tenn., and the School of Prophets in Dallas. He has 33 years of pastoral experience, including churches in Jackson, Milan and Knoxville. He and his wife, Maxine, have three grown children.

The church's minister of music is Tim Parker, and the ministers of youth are John and Carol Stout.

End of story? Not so.

Milam is interested in building a residential facility on church property for elderly members of the church.

"We want them to be able to live near the church they have attended all their lives," he says. "They want to do that, we know."

There are no specific plans drawn at the time for the project. The church is actively discussing it and knows it will do it.

Was there ever really any question about that?
